Message from the President

Greetings citizens,

They say spring is a time of renewal, and that will be the case in the Village of Hampton. Over the next few months, you will see a few changes that I believe will be for the positive. First, at some point in the next few weeks, our new LED sign should be up on Rt 84. This project has been three years in the making . The Village was awarded a grant to buy the sign that is being installed. When the project is over, it will have cost the Village zero dollars. We thank Representative Greg Johnson and his staff, as well as Village Clerk, Michelle, for their hard work to get this project over the finish line.

I am writing this message fresh out of a meeting that was held to inform residents of some of the new ordinance changes. If you go to www.hamptonil.org and look on the General Information page, you will have access to the ordinances and there is a search bar available to locate particular ordinances.

Sometime around Memorial Day weekend, the Sheriff’s Deputies will be out and about looking for code violations, During that time, warnings will be issued and violations documented giving residents an opportunity to corrective actions. Some of the primary violations that they will be looking for include tall grass, abandon/derelect vehicles, parking in yards and junk/trash issues. Our goal is to begin enforcing the ordinances as they are written.

Another improvement will be the change to Republic for trash, recycling and yard waste. This change will take place at the beginning of July. A Message From Republic Services®

The Village of Hampton has partnered with Republic Services for city-wide recycling and waste collection.

•Starting **July 7, 2026**, your waste collection will occur every **Tuesday**



•Recycling collection will occur every other **Tuesday**.

•Republic Services is providing each house with a 95-gallon recycling cart and a 95-gallon trash cart. All material must be in the carts provided. Material placed outside the carts will not be collected.

•If more carts are needed, they can be ordered through your online account or by contacting **563.332.0050** (for an additional monthly charge).

Additional Services

Yard Waste Collection

Residents will have the option to individually subscribe to a 96-gallon yard waste cart, which will be serviced weekly April through November. Use your online account or call **563.332.0050** to sign up for this service at a rate of \$125 per year. The subscription will stay active until canceled.

Bulk Waste Collection

Residents will be able to dispose of up to 3 bulk items and 1 cubic yard of containerized material during the annual city cleanup. For bulk collection outside of the annual cleanup event, call **563.332.0050** or request service through the app. Additional charges will apply.

Books & Bake Sale

The Hampton Historical Society will have a Book & Bake Sale on Saturday, June 13th at the Brettun & Black Museum. The sale will run from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. The store counters in the museum will hold an array of homemade baked goods including pies, cookies, quick breads, and other treats.

The book sale will feature a variety of used books at bargain prices. The sale also will include a selection of new books from local and regional authors. From 11:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m., Misty Urban, a popular romance writer from Muscatine, will be on hand for a meet-and-greet. At 1:00 p.m., Hampton author Tom McKay will present a free, one-hour Introduction to Writing Short Stories workshop.
