We appreciate the Village allowing us to share quarterly news and communication in this newsletter. With this being our first edition, Hampton School Board would like to take this opportunity to celebrate some of the many successes our students, staff, and community have achieved this year.

One area of pride has been the district's continued commitment to fiscal responsibility. Through thoughtful planning of taxpayer resources, over the last three years the district was able to lower its tax rate while continuing to provide high-quality educational opportunities for students. We remain committed to being good stewards of community resources.

We are also proud that Hampton has been recognized as a Capturing Kids' Hearts National Showcase School. This distinction reflects the intentional efforts of our staff and students to create a safe, welcoming, and positive school climate where meaningful relationships support both academic and personal growth.

The results of these efforts are evident not only in our school climate but also in our students' academic achievements. As many of our students move on to United Township High School, here is an amazing statistic to share. This year, Hampton students represented approximately 6% of the incoming freshman class at UT, yet they accounted for 12% of the Magna Cum Laude recipients (weighted GPA of 4.3–4.49) and an impressive 30% of the Summa Cum Laude recipients (weighted GPA of 4.5 or higher). These accomplishments are a testament to the dedication of our students, the support of their families, and the commitment of our staff to providing a high-quality educational experience.

As we look ahead, we are excited to continue building on these successes together. We encourage you to stay connected and engaged as we continue our work on behalf of Hampton students. School board meetings are held on the third Monday of each month, and we welcome your attendance and participation. Thank you for your continued partnership and support of Hampton School.
